

# Northwest Iowa Bandmasters Association

## Fall Meeting – September 6, 2008

The NWIBA Fall Meeting was called to order by President Kurt Schwarck at 1:15 p.m. on September 6, 2008 at the Coyote Canyon restaurant in Sioux City, Iowa. President Schwarck thanked Mike Hogan of Jay's Music, and Ray and Mike Guntren of Ray's Midbell Music for their support of our sightreading clinic and for providing lunch.

**I. Secretary's Report** – The Secretary's report from the May 9, 2008 meeting at the IBA conference in Des Moines was read by Secretary Paul Jepson and approved.

**II. Treasurer's Report** – Treasurer Curt Ohrlund reported that NWIBA has \$11,216.58 in checking and \$8362.00 in CD accounts for a balance of \$19578.58 at this time. MM-Seconded - Treasurer's report approved.
